## Marine transportation of transformers for the Lower Churchill Project

Mammoet advises the public that starting July 19, two shipments of seven transformers weighing 200 metric tonnes each will travel by barge from the Bay Bulls Marine Terminal in Newfoundland, to the Town of Cartwright in Labrador. Each marine shipment is anticipated to take approximately three to five days.

For the safety of the public and workers, Mammoet asks the public to be mindful of the safety hazards associated with working in marine conditions during the loading, transportation and offloading operations of the transformers. These are high-risk activities and require a stable working environment to ensure the safety of the public and workers carrying out this work.

For the safety of those on the water, it is important for boaters to ensure a wide berth is given to the barge during transportation and a safe distance is maintained at all times. Members of the public are asked to respect restricted areas of the port while the barge is docking and transformers are being offloaded to ensure the safety of the public and all individuals involved in the operation.
