## SITE SPECIFIC MEASURES COVID-19 UPDATED

Understandably many are becoming increasingly concerned about the potential spread of COVID-19 in Canada and NL. We want to reassure you that Lower Churchill Project has made this issue a top priority and is doing everything we can to preserve the health and welfare of employees and their families at this time.

The Public Health Agency of Canada considers Covid-19 a serious health threat, and the situation is evolving daily. The risk to Canadians is considered high and a declaration of a public health emergency is in effect in NL. Because information on COVID-19 is moving at such a rapid pace, and in an effort to keep you as up-to-date as possible, we will continue to send regular communications. We are closely following updates from the WHO, Government of Canada and Government of Newfoundland and Labrador and have updated LCP plans as required. We have also engaged the services of a 3<sup>rd</sup> party physician who is a Contagious Disease Expert to assist in the process.

The following are some ongoing measures implemented as well as some new measures to date:

1. Emergency Response Plan for management of potential Covid-19 case on-site.
2. Emergency Response Protocols for first responders.
3. Site Clinic implementation of Covid-19 triage screening tool as per Regional CDC Nurse.
4. Communication protocols with Medical Officer of Health (MOH) for the province.

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5. Travel protocols as per Gov't of Canada Travel Advisory – If travelled outside of Province or Canada, 14 days Self Isolation required prior to being granted access to site.
6. Development of pre-screening protocols for all personnel that are required to attend the Muskrat Falls Site.
7. Numerous communications on prevention of the spread of airborne pathogens such as Covid-19.
8. Protocol for body temperature surveillance developed and implemented, temperature check reminders posted around Camp. Taking place at 6:00AM & 6:00PM at the camp games and board room and at the main gate as required.

#### Camp Accommodations:

1. Support of Labrador Catering in implementation of Contractor Pandemic Plan.
2. Immediate/ongoing allocation and mobilization of resources to perform increased frequency of disinfection of high touch surfaces in all areas of Camp Accommodation Complex.
3. Allocation of Camp Rooms so there will be no sharing of shower facilities.
4. Removal of self-service (buffet) stations. Alternative options will be provided.
5. Individual wrapping of kitchen utensils.
6. Increased dining hall food consumption area to improve social distancing.

7. Barricades have been put in front of the serving line, creating greater separation from the food when being served.
8. Extra hypoallergenic scent free soap and cleaning supplies are being sourced / ordered and will be available upon request after these products are received. If required see staff at the front desk in the Big Land Lodge.
9. Social Distancing at the dinner tables in the dining hall - signs posted reminding of this requirement. All are asked to work collaboratively to comply and intervene in a positive manner if other patrons are not complying.
10. Signs have been posted at the entrance to the dining hall reminding everyone to wash their hands before entering and proceeding to the Serving Line.
11. Visual indicators (floor stickers) will be placed on the dining hall floor as a guide to assist personal in maintaining 2M (6') distance from one another while waiting in the serving line.

**If you are symptomatic while On Site, before attending at the Site Clinic, please call the non-emergency number (709) 899-4296 and follow their guidance.**

**If you are symptomatic while Off Site or On Turnaround, do not return to site, self-isolate and call your Local Health Authority at 811 before going to your Doctor or Hospital. Follow instructions given. Notify your Company / Supervisor.**
