

Nalcor Energy: Summary of COVID-19 Health & Safety Protocols (Muskrat Falls Site) Updated June 22, 2021

The safety of our workers, their families, our communities, and the public is of utmost importance to Nalcor and we are taking all responsible measures possible to protect the health and safety of our workers and the community.

As the province moves forward in its reopening plan, Nalcor is taking steps to align COVID-19 protocols and testing requirements with the Together. Again. plan. We are also taking the necessary steps to safely and permanently close the Muskrat Falls camp. We continue to ensure our COVID-19 protocols and safety measures meet or exceed Public Health guidance. We will continue to monitor the situation closely.

Thanks to the support of Labrador Grenfell Health (LGH), vaccination uptake for workers at the Muskrat Falls site has been very successful. Currently vaccination uptake of first and second doses for workers at the Muskrat Falls site exceeds the overall provincial average.

Aligning with the opening of the Atlantic Bubble, as of June 23, 2021, **workers who are residents of Atlantic Canada will not need to self-isolate or require pre-access COVID-19 testing.** Now having met the requirement set out in Step one of Together. Again. reopening plan, as of July 1, **fully vaccinated residents of Canada will not need to self-isolate or require pre-access COVID-19 testing. Partially vaccinated Canadians must self-isolate until they present a negative test.** All other testing and isolation requirements for unvaccinated Canadians and out of country workers will remain in place.

In preparation for the closure of the Muskrat Falls camp, effective July 3, 2021, management of LCP, Contractors and Power Supply employees will be able to start living in Happy Valley-Goose Bay and travel to and from site each day. We have initiated planning to **permanently close the Muskrat Falls camp, which we anticipate to be closed sometime in July 2021.** Once the camp closes, all workers will travel to and from upper Lake Melville to the Muskrat Falls site for the duration of the project.

We have prepared the following summary of the various safety protocols.

1. Work Rotations:

- The standard rotation for LCP workers at the Muskrat Falls site is two weeks at site, then off for two weeks. Once the camp closes, there may be changes to rotations and shifts; these changes will be communicated with workers by their employer.

2. COVID-19 Testing:

- With a significant portion of the Muskrat Falls workforce now fully vaccinated, testing for NL workers and workers from Atlantic Canada is no longer required.
- As of July 1, fully vaccinated residents of Canada will not need to self-isolate or require pre-access COVID-19 testing.
- Partially vaccinated Canadians must self-isolate until they present a negative test.
- All other testing and isolation requirements for unvaccinated Canadians and out of country workers will remain in place.

3. Temperature and Screening Checks:

- Prior to travelling to site workers must complete a COVID-19 screening questionnaire. This gathers information about the individual's recent activities and potential contact with others who could be impacted by COVID-19.
- Before travelling to site every worker must have their temperature checked. Anyone with a temperature of 38 degrees Celsius or above will be denied access to the MF work site.

4. Travel Protocols:

- For workers flying to Labrador, individuals must follow all NL Public Health and federal travel protocols.
- Workers travelling to site on busses and planes must follow NL Public Health measures and maintain physical distancing.

5. On-site Protocols:

- The following are some of the safety rules in place at the MF site:
 - All workers must have a daily temperature check.
 - Masks are to be worn throughout the worksite and camp, except when in assigned camp room.
 - Enhanced cleaning and disinfection measures are in place in all locations.
 - 2m distance from others in all locations must be maintained (there are specific exemptions depending on the work task and in these cases other safety measures are in place).
 - Physical distancing in place – food line up, reduced seating at tables while eating, plastic barriers in place for servers, etc.
 - Enhanced measures in the dining hall - no buffet stations, utensils are wrapped, etc.

6. On-site Isolation Protocols:

- Isolation protocols are in place should someone at site develop COVID-19 like symptoms, and/or if an individual is contacted by Public Health as part of their contact tracing process.
- Individuals are immediately placed in isolation in a designated location at camp away from others. They are not allowed to have any contact with others until cleared to do so.
- Public Health is contacted and these individuals must remain in isolation until cleared by Public Health. Additional testing will be completed if that is the guidance provided by Public Health.
